SARGENT STEWARDSHIP AWARD

The 2001 Leonard and Sandy Sargent Stewardship Award was presented to [Ron Marcoux and Gary Wolfe](#) for their work to extend permanent conservation protection over 7,850 acres of critical habitat owned by the Church Universal and Triumphant (CUT) land that is situated north of Yellowstone National Park through direct acquisition and conservation easement. This action was probably the most significant wildlife conservation achievement in the vicinity of Yellowstone since the creation of the park itself. They selected one recipient to receive the \$5,000 award.
