Margot Higgins is a US Environmental and Cultural History instructor at UC Berkeley and a research assistant at the National Park Service investigating best practices for citizen science phenology programs as part of their climate change education pilot study in California. She also serves on the advisory board of the Wrangell Mountains Center in Alaska.

An environmental social scientist and historian, who has worked professionally as a journalist, documentary filmmaker, campaign organizer, college instructor and organization leader.
