The 2004 Leonard and Sandy Sargent Stewardship Award was presented to **Cesar Hernandez** for exceptional creativity and tenacity over more than 30 years as he addressed myriad environmental issues in northwestern Montana. He founded the Northwest Citizens for Wilderness and its extension, the Northwest Citizens for Wilderness Mining Company that protects the Scotchman's Peak Wilderness Study Area by filing and holding mining claims; founded the Cabinet Resource Council; prevented a re-regulating dam on the Kootenai River, as well as a whole host of other accomplishments. Cesar selected one recipient to receive the \$5,000 award.
