

2022 CONSERVATION PARTNERS

Each year the Cinnabar Foundation partners with scores of nonprofit organizations and educational institutions working within Montana and the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem. We prioritize science-based, strategic, collaborative and community-based opportunities that demonstrate strong leadership and effectiveness.

Our grantees use a large tool box of approaches — advocacy, outreach, education, economics, law, policy, research, organizing, and "boots on the ground" — to achieve long-lasting tangible conservation solutions. Cinnabar has an impressive track record of supporting emerging and experienced leaders as well as incubating creative solutions to conservation challenges.

We are proud to report that, in 2022, the Cinnabar Foundation awarded,65 grants that required at least a 1:1 match, and 6 awards totaling \$502,000. Our grantees impressively leveraged this funding resulting in a total of more than \$1 million directly supporting conservation in Montana and the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem.

New in 2022, the Cinnabar Foundation invited 15 long-time grantees to participate in a pilot program offering 3-year guaranteed funding for the organizations' general operations. These exceptional organizations are denoted by a blue asterisk after their organizational name.
